A Message from our Senior Pastor

Dear CCC Family and Friends,

I love the way that novelist Philip Roth describes the process of writing: *Exhilaration and groaning. Frustration and freedom. Inspiration and uncertainty. Abundance and emptiness. Blazing forth and muddling through. The day-by-day repertoire of oscillating dualities that any talent withstands — and tremendous solitude, too. And the silence: 50 years in a room silent as the bottom of a pool, eking out, when all went well, my minimum daily allowance of usable prose.*

The same words could be used to describe ministry.

2018 has started off as a busy year at Community, full of exhilaration. We have remodeling projects taking place in the nursery, library, and men's restroom. We have a worship service with talented musicians and participants, worshipping in a packed sanctuary. We will meet all day this coming Saturday, with Agile church and our dream team leaders, to gather and assimilate the information from our dream team sessions. And we are planning for the future.

I have shared with the Church Leadership Team, goals for 2018—both as a congregation and as a pastor. Not always knowing what the future holds, but trusting it will unfold with God's guidance, is one of the central tenets of our faith.

2017 Highlights from Mission First Team

It was a busy Christmas season and year for the Mission First Team. Here are some of the highlights of what the congregation helped us accomplish:

The Christmas party that was held for the students at Columbia Elementary school was a huge success! Over 200 gifts were wrapped and distributed, 34 \$10 gift cards were donated for families in transition, 150 books were donated to the school for classroom use, 34 volunteers wrapped all of the gifts, and 16 volunteers helped with the party.

Thanks to all members of Community Christian Church who helped in any way with donations of gifts, wrapping paper, etc., wrapped gifts and came to the school to distribute the gifts. In addition to the party CCC has a number of volunteers that visit the school weekly to tutor the students in reading and math.

Thank you to the volunteers that rang the bell for the Salvation Army! During the seven day that CCC members “manned the kettle” we put in a total of 116 hours which, according to the way the Salvation Army calculates its’ costs, saved them \$2,088!

By supporting the Circle of Concern Giving Tree seven families had a brighter Christmas as 81 gifts were purchased for 25 people.

Volunteers from CCC provided a Christmas lunch and fun crafts and gifts for the girls in the Knobel dorm at Epworth Children’s Home. The volunteers will continue to visit the girls monthly in the coming year.

Thank you to everyone who has supported our ongoing partnership with Hanna Woods Elementary school to provide backpacks filled with healthy foods to help keep students fed over the weekend. We will provide backpacks for the months of February and April.

Thank you Liz Dupuis for her continued work in planning our church blood drives. A total of 74 pints of blood was collected at these drives in 2017 which helped up to 222 people in need! The next blood drive at CCC will be March 4, 2018.

Diane Hall organized donations of cleaning buckets and supplies for Church World Services after the historic flooding in Texas and other areas. Enough donations were made to assemble more than 25 buckets.

Many CCC members participated in our two All Church Mission days last year. We were able to help with a variety of local and global mission projects.

We are ready to start planning for 2018 but we need more people with an interest in mission to join the Mission First Team. We also need someone that will lead the team and help with communication between the team and the Core Leadership Team. The more people we have the more wonderful things we can do!
