### 2019 Stewardship Campaign

On Sunday, November 4th, we participated in our semi-annual day of service and mission. We made breakfast at the Ronald-McDonald house for families who are staying with children that are critically ill, painted rooms at the Valentine House for clients of Caring Solutions, and worked here at Community where we expanded our butterfly garden, colored placemats for a local nursing home, packed hygiene kits for the Festival of Sharing and penned cards of thanks to those who serve in the military. After a day of service, we then gathered back in the Wunderlich Center for a meal and fellowship. It was a wonderful day as we embodied the lyrics of the worship song, "Go Make A Difference."

We recently sent 2019 pledge cards (see below for a copy if you still need one). Your returned pledge card will help us plan for how we will make a difference in 2019. Every dollar counts. Sometimes, like this past weekend while serving others, the giving is very visible. Other times, the giving is not as obvious, but equally powerful. For example, as we celebrated the lives of our beloved this fall it has been a wonderful gift of giving to gather in the gym where we can come together as one celebrating, and mourning, as a community. And this summer, it was a blessing to have new air conditioning systems keeping the sanctuary cool for three beautiful weddings.

In an effort to be as transparent as possible, and show how every single dollar counts, we have shared with you the proposed 2019 budget (see page 5). The leaders of the church have attempted to craft a budget that reflects, through surveys and conversations, the hopes and dreams of our community. Please note that in this budget the percentage designated for outreach is approximately 7% and the remaining balance for the Wunderlich Center is \$257,496. With the monthly payment of \$4,454 per month, only the interest payment (<\$1,000 per month in 2019) is part of the operating budget, the principal payment comes from members contributing to the Wunderlich debt reduction fund.

Our goal is to have all pledge cards returned by this Sunday, November 18<sup>th</sup>, when we celebrate as a community, our Thanksgiving meal. Thank you for making a difference and participating in the life of our Community.

During our October set up and the actual October Stable Sale, over 2,000 hours were volunteered! And that doesn't even count the hours you all spent scouring closets for donations or the time in the kitchen making food for the workers! We appreciate everything you have done to make 2018 another successful year for the Stable!

After the sale was over on Saturday, October 13th, 335 clients of Circle Of Concern came and got items that will make their life a little easier and more fun! After the sale remaining items have been donated to: St. Cronin Parish, South Kings Highway, Isaiah 58 at Compton Heights Christian Church, Church on the Street in St. Louis City, Herbert Hoover Boys and Girls Club, Mathews-Dickey Boys' & Girls' Club, Memorial Boulevard Christian Church and Pilgrim United Church of Christ.

In addition to the Stable budget this year, we recently gave \$17,000 to be used to light the cross on the front of the church and for new dimmable LED lights in the Wunderlich Family Life Center gym, as the lighting in there is has been very poor. In addition to the \$36,000 that was given from our budget earlier this year to pay down the balance of the loan on WFLC, an additional \$38,000 was given in October to be applied to the loan.
