MESSAGE FROM OUR SENIOR MINISTER

Dear Community,

Technically, according to the church calendar, I'm writing to you in the New Year. And this New Year is off to a wonderful start. I am so proud of our church and community. In 2018 we accomplished four major goals: 1) We officially adopted our revised constitution and governance structure; 2) We created and adopted new vision and mission statements; 3) We voted to become an Open and Affirming congregation; and 4) We launched our new legacy fund. All of this took the hard work and dedication of many. For this I give thanks.

Now, the fun can really begin! The last several years have been spent regrouping, reorganizing and restructuring. With the necessity of such tasks accomplished, we can focus on welcoming new friends, strengthening old relationships, and dreaming about the future. And we can do all of this with a balanced budget for both this calendar year and next (with the outreach staying at a strong 8%).

One of the major goals for 2019 will be the new Joe and Betty Bremer memorial garden. For several years now, I have dreamed and prayed about creating a garden not only for our community, but also for the greater community (our neighbors). And now, with memorial funds available from the Bremers, we are going to create a community garden that has a small greenhouse, hoop house (allowing for an extension of the growing seasons), two large raised beds (maintained by members and friends of CCC) and fifteen (to start with) smaller individual beds for CCC friends or friends in the neighborhood. We are actively drawing plans for the new garden and once this is completed, we'll be sure to share all of the information. If you would like to help with the garden, maintain a bed, or participate in a scheduled work day this spring as we put it all together, please let me know. The possibilities for this new ministry are endless—donating fresh food, cooking classes, canning classes, conversations on faith and ecology—and all very exciting!

Finally, just a quick note to say, as I did in worship two weeks ago, thank you for a glorious five years of ministry thus far. I am truly blessed to serve a church with such committed individuals and Christ followers. We have accomplished a lot these past five years and I look forward to seeing what God has planned for us next. Thank you for loving me and my family so deeply.
