MESSAGE FROM OUR SENIOR MINISTER

Dear Community,

In church last Sunday, I mentioned that it is rare these days to know someone who made a lifelong spiritual journey with one church or one denomination. Yet this past Tuesday, as I had the honor and privilege to officiate and celebrate the life of Richard Ragland, a beloved saint of our church, and whose family, as he once said, is etched into the mortars of the sanctuary, I listened as his niece, Jennie, shared that Richard was indeed a "cradle to grave" Disciples of Christ.

For many, the journey of discipleship is peripatetic—we start and stop, moving one way and then another. But for Richard, it was a straight shot—he knew who he was and to whom he belonged. And though he dined with governors, stood side by side with generals, and held numerous awards and recognitions, what I will remember most about Richard Ragland is his faithfulness and devotion to God. Each time that I visited his apartment, I would see Richard's Bible close by—every day, for Richard, started with God and scripture.

And so in a time when we wait eagerly for spring, and a thawing of winter, I share with you today a prayer that I read at Richard's funeral. It's actually a prayer written by Richard, from his days as an Elder, at Community Christian Church. The elegance of the words and the depths of the conviction, fill me with hope and courage on this journey of life. I pray the same is true for you:

O God our Father, you dwell in light unapproachable, and, as the heavens are high above the earth, so are your ways higher than our ways and your thoughts than our thoughts.

Yet you have breathed your Spirit into our lives, you have formed our minds to seek you and inclined our hearts to love you. You have made us restless for the rest that is only in you, and have planted within us a hunger and thirst that makes us dissatisfied with the things of earth.

We thank you, O Lord, for that knocking at our hearts' door which tells us of your waiting presence. We bless you for your hand upon our lives, and for the sure knowledge that, however we may falter and fail, underneath are the everlasting arms.

Father, give us grace today to recognize the stirrings of your Spirit within our souls and to listen most attentively to all that you have to say to us. Let not the noises of the world ever so confuse us that we cannot hear you speak. May we never deceive ourselves as to the meaning of your commands, and so let us all in all things obey your will.

You know the inmost need of each one of us, Father. Hear then the silent prayer of each one, and in your mercy and wisdom answer them in accordance with your holy will. Be with those of our church family who are ill or infirm, those older ones whose mind and memory have fled, those who are bearing difficult burdens alone, those who sorrow and all family circles broken by death. Be in every sore heart, in every stricken home, by every bed of pain, giving to all the consolation of your peace and sustaining them with the hope and courage that comes from trust in your promises. Strengthen our faith.

Forgive us Lord, if in the past week we have done or said anything to increase the pain of the world. In your great mercy, blot out our sins from the book of your remembrance, and restore us to fellowship with you.

To your care, O father, we commend our souls and the souls of all whom we love. We pray through Jesus Christ, our Lord, who taught us when we pray to say...

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed by thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven, give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our debts as we forgive our debtors, and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory forever and ever. Amen.
