MESSAGE FROM OUR SENIOR MINISTER

The front page of yesterday's *St. Louis Post* included this headline: Life expectancy drops in state as overdoses, suicides, rise.

There were over 1,000,000 attempted suicides in the United States last year. More than 47,000 of these suicides were successful. The numbers are both staggering and sickening. Most of us know someone who has suicidal thoughts, tried suicide or committed suicide.

The number of overdoses is no less unsettling. The death rate for Missouri residents in the age group of fifteen-to-forty-four years of age has increased thirty percent since 2012. A significant amount of this increase is due to opioid related deaths.

As a pastor, I have officiated services for those who have died of both suicide and overdoses. It is not easy. As a pastor, it also troubles me that the resources we have to prevent such deaths are often tucked away in the basement, out of sight. This is true for most other churches as well.

When people are hurting and struggling, the church is a place where groups can meet on a weekly basis. But somehow, we need, as a community, to help make the transition from the basement to the sanctuary. We need to find a way to let people know that it's okay to hurt and when you are experiencing feelings of depression, church is a safe and welcoming place to be.

So how do we do this?

Just a couple of quick thoughts: 1) Love people where they are and be vulnerable. It is okay to share what you're feeling at church; 2) Let's consider having some Sunday School classes with professionals that deal with mental health; and 3) Someday I would love for us to give rent-free office space to a local therapist in exchange for reduced charges for our friends/members who would like to see a therapist (a good practice for everyone at all times in life).

Let's continue to find innovative ways to be a community to our community.
